

What You Need to Know Before Coming to CHL Class.

The Blackland CHL class offers you the following:

- A passport picture and holder.
- A student packet consisting of CHL Laws, DPS application to carry, FBI and DPS fingerprint cards, a class evaluation form, 3 affidavits.
- A notary on site for your DPS affidavits.
- An onsite firing range.
- A Certificate of Proficiency after passing final exams.

Included in this Pre-Class packet are the following:

- Blackland s Payment and Refund Policy.
- What to bring and wear to class.

Range Rules

1. The Range Officer is in charge of the range.
2. All weapons will be handled as if loaded.
3. Never point the muzzle of your weapon at anything you are not willing to destroy.
4. Only the number of ammo ordered by the Range Officer will be loaded.
5. No holsters will be worn on the range.
6. All weapons will remain secured, according to the Range Officer's orders, when not on the line.
7. Do Not step off the line until you have secured your handgun.
8. Keep your finger out of the trigger guard until ready to shoot.
9. Ear and eye protection devices are mandatory on the range.
10. Shirts with collars or neck towels are mandatory while on the range.
11. Individuals who have consumed alcohol or any substance that may impair mental or physical faculties will not be allowed on the range.

12. No laser devices or hollow point ammunition are allowed.
13. Blackland Gun Works has the right to dismiss any student at any time.
14. Jams and malfunctions during the shooting course can cause the student to lose points or retake the course at the end of the class.

Payment and Refund Policy

CHL Class Fee Policies

Prepayment is required 5 days prior to actual class time.

There are no refunds. In cases of extreme emergencies, classes can be rescheduled.

All Classes are subject to cancellation and rescheduling if a minimum of 4 students is not met.

We take major credit cards, money orders, checks and yep! we even take cash.

What to Bring and Wear to Class

All students must wear protective clothing on the day of the shooting proficiency exam. Protective clothing consists of the following:

1. Ear and eye protection devices.
2. Shirts with collars or neck towels.
3. No open-toed shoes or shorts on the firing range.

The handgun you use to take your shooting proficiency exam will be inspected for safety in class.

- Make sure your gun is unloaded before bringing it into the class room.
- Make sure your handgun is clean and in good shooting condition. Malfunctions & jams on the range can cause you to lose points or retake the shooting exam at the end of the class.

FYI - Testing with a revolver allows you a license to carry only a revolver. Testing with an semi-automatic will allow you to carry either. Minimum caliber semi-automatic handgun is a 32. Range exam requires 50 rounds.

Last but not least, bring a smile. Although this is a serious class, we still want you to relax and enjoy.

Proficiency Demonstration Course of Fire

The proficiency demonstration course of fire will be at distances of three, seven, and fifteen yards, for a total of fifty rounds.

Twenty rounds will be fired from three yards, as follows:

(A) five rounds will be fired •One Shot Exercise; two seconds allowed for each shot;

(B) ten rounds will be fired •Two Shot Exercise; three seconds allowed for each two shots; and

(C) five rounds will be fired; ten seconds allowed for five shots.

Twenty rounds will be fired from seven yards, fired in four five-shot strings as follows:

(A) the first five shots will be fired in ten seconds;

(B) the next five shots will be fired in two stages:
 (i) two shots will be fired in four seconds; and
 (ii) three shots will be fired in six seconds.

(C) the next five shots at seven yards will be fired. One Shot Exercise; three seconds will be allowed for each shot; and

(D) the last five shots fired at the seven-yard line, the time will be fifteen seconds to shoot five rounds.

Ten rounds will be fired from fifteen yards, fired in two five-shot strings as follows:

(A) the first five shots will be fired in two stages:

(i) two shots fired in six seconds; and

(ii) three shots fired in nine seconds.

(B) the last five shots will be fired in fifteen seconds.
